#### **Angel Tree**

e are starting a new coffee cup collection for September and October. Angel Tree supports prisoners' family relationships by providing a way for them to give Christmas presents to their children. Local Prison Fellowship volunteers work with churches and prison chaplains to buy and deliver the presents. As long as prisoners are allowed access to their children, they are given the opportunity to apply for a gift to be sent to them. Each gift is dispatched as though it is from the parent in prison and is accompanied by a personal message written by the parent for their child.

Angel Tree is a very simple and incredibly rewarding way to help prisoners keep contact with their families, which has been shown to reduce re-offending. Those prisoners being visited by a partner or family member have a 52% reoffending rate as compared to 70% for those who do not.

internationally to achieve this. Amen.

- THURS \ Pray that God will restrain those who use drones and other remotely controlled devices as weapons to destroy innocent people and pray for military leaders who decide to target dangerous extremists to consider the moral implications of their actions.
- for the ways that artificial intelligence and robots will benefit the 28 world y freeing human workers from repetitive, hazardous and taxing tasks and bringing innovation to industry, transport, surgery, food production, finance and many other spheres of life.
- SAT \ Pray about the development of robots to serve older people in care homes, hospitals and their own homes, especially as the population ages, offering help with everyday tasks. Pray for developments to be positive and life-enhancing.
