Following the Chancellor's announcement in his Spending Review this week of a 'temporary' reduction in the international development budget, [Bishop Steven has written to all MPs](#) representing the three counties of Oxfordshire, Berkshire, and Buckinghamshire to express his disappointment at the decision and to urge them to reject the cuts. Our church has a connection with HMP Grendon and Springhill through Revd Sue Smith who lives in Stone and worships with us when she can. She will also be leading our service on 13th December. This Christmas we have decided to support the work Sue does as part of the prison chaplaincy team. So we are asking for donations towards the cost of **500 pairs of socks** that will be given out to the men as a Christmas present from the chaplaincy, so they know they are not forgotten. For some this will be the first Christmas present they have received for many years.
