#### **Extracts from Bishop Steven's letter to the Diocese**

'For I am convinced that neither death nor life nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus'

Romans 8:37-39

......How can we live well as Christians in these times? Our aim must be to bring as much of the church safely through the pandemic as we are able but also to continue to extend love and care to our neighbours in months of acute spiritual, physical and social need: to be the Body of Christ in the world. This is the call of every disciple to everyday faith.

......we need a new horizon for our hope and for our lives. I want to suggest that all of us set that horizon now on Easter, not Christmas .............We now know the journey will be a marathon, not a sprint.

#### **Current arrangements at SJB**

Each Sunday morning the church will be open from 10.15am. There will be a Worship Service at 10.30am and the church will remain open until 11.30am. More formal services such as Holy Communion will not be resumed for some time due to the present COVID19 regulations.
