Stone's Community Response to Coronavirus - update

The **Stone Community Support Group** is busy out in Stone every day - helping selfisolators stay in and keep safe. After being buddied up with a nearby helper people are having prescriptions picked up, friendly phone calls, daily paper deliveries, shopping, dog walking, etc (anything within reason!).

It has been a great privilege to speak to vulnerable people and match them up with a helper. Initial anxieties about asking for help are soon brushed aside and people's gratitude has been amazing.

This week I put out a 'shout out' on the Facebook group for a prescription to be picked up. It took less than a minute for a volunteer to say 'yes'. I've even had self-isolators phoning to ask for their Government food parcels to be picked up and taken to Aylesbury Storehouse Foodbank.

Our only problem is we don't have enough self-isolators to help - I have numerous volunteers on a waiting list. So if you should be 'Staying Home and Staying Safe' please feel free to ring me up and I'll arrange for a volunteer to help you. It isn't too late to ask.

A big thank you to all volunteers - they are doing the work while I'm just co-ordinating the system.
