### A New Year message from the Archbishop of Canterbury

The Archbishop of Canterbury has urged people to make personal connections with others in 2020 to create a new unity in a divided society. In his New Year message, Justin Welby said:

"Let's go for a heroic new year's resolution. Let's resolve to reconnect. To reach out to just one person we don't know, or from whom we have drifted apart. Pick one person. Pick up the phone. Send them a text. Meet them for a cup of tea. Make that connection. Let's begin cementing our unity one brick at a time. It could be someone you know. It could be someone you've always wanted to connect with but never have. It could be someone you really disagree with".

"When we hear someone described as a good Samaritan, we think about that person taking the time to help another. But it's a story told by Jesus about someone taking the risk of reaching out to another who was very different to them. Yes, the person needed help – but they also needed connection. Jesus took the risk of connecting with people who were separated from him".
