Pathways returning - online

The summer edition of Pathways, our diocesan magazine, will be available in the coming days. This edition focuses on the environment, and addresses the hopes and fears we all have as we face the climate crisis. Is this a time when the hope we have as Christians shines more brightly in the gathering gloom?



The Association of Christian Counsellors (ACC) is providing a new service in response to the distress and suffering of many people as a result of the pandemic. ACC's COVID-19 Crisis Counselling Support Service is for anyone in the UK, whatever their faith, who has been bereaved during the time of the epidemic and anyone working within an NHS setting in a frontline role.

The service offers anyone who is eligible up to ten sessions of counselling on a nofee basis from a professionally trained counsellor. Tread safely

Those who are particularly vulnerable have barely left their homes, and others have become used to working from home in ways that we would not have considered possible at the beginning of the year.
