James 3:1-12

1 Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers and sisters, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness. 2 For all of us make many mistakes. Anyone who makes no mistakes in speaking is perfect, able to keep the whole body in check with a bridle. 3 If we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we guide their whole bodies. 4 Or look at ships: though they are so large that it takes strong winds to drive them, yet they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs. 5 So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great exploits. How great a forest is set ablaze by a small fire! 6 And the tongue is a fire. The tongue is placed among our members as a world of iniquity; it stains the whole body, sets on fire the cycle of nature, and is itself set on fire by hell.7 For every species of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by the human species, 8 but no one can tame the tonque--a restless evil, full of deadly poison. 9 With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse those who are made in the likeness of God. 10 From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this ought not to be so. 11 Does a spring pour forth from the same opening both fresh and brackish water? 12 Can a fig tree, my brothers and sisters, yield olives, or a grapevine figs? No more can salt water yield fresh.

James is talking about the fact that when we speak we can either bless and encourage someone, or we can criticise them. We should however speak to others in the same way we speak to God. After all, what we say is a reflection of what is going on deep inside us. He then uses three metaphors to illustrate how powerful the tongue is:

- 1. A rider can control the strength, speed, and direction of a horse with a very small tool the bit in its mouth. By controlling the bit the rider controls the whole body of the horse.
- 2. A rudder is also a small tool controlling a big vessel. The captain who can keep control of a ship's rudder in a storm can emerge intact and on course.
- 3. Unlike the bit and the rudder though, the flame is uncontrolled and uncontrollable, and what it sets in motion is not purposeful but destructive.

We should always be mindful of the effect our words can have on others, and think carefully before we speak, especially if we have the authority of a teacher.



Dear Lord, we all have times when we say things we know we should not have said. Help us to consider more carefully the effect our words may have on others before we speak them, and to seek forgiveness when we get it wrong. Teach us to speak in ways that bring encouragement to others, and praises to you. May the words of our mouths and the meditations of our hearts be pleasing to you, O Lord, our rock and our redeemer. Amen
