BELONG - BELIEVE - BUILD - WITH CHRIST AS THE CORNERSTONE

John 6:51-58

51 I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever. This bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world."

52 Then the Jews began to argue sharply among themselves, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?"

53 Jesus said to them, "Very truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. 54 Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day. 55 For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. 56 Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them. 57 Just as the living Father sent me and I live because of the Father, so the one who feeds on me will live because of me. 58 This is the bread that came down from heaven. Your ancestors ate manna and died, but whoever feeds on this bread will live forever."



Some of us have not taken Holy Communion for a while. The service at Easter was the first opportunity for many apart from the virtual communions on line. Before then we were used to having regular communion in church. Communion reminds us of Jesus' sacrifice of himself. It unites us in worship, and brings us together as a family.

Although this passage points to the communion service the language is stark and it caused disagreements. No wonder the crowd questioned it. How or why would anyone want to eat another person?

Jesus is the Living Bread. He is the Daily Bread for which we ask. He gives us the grace we need to get by, he sustains us spiritually, and he heals us, comforts us and strengthens us. He says in verse 56 'whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them'.

Jesus is calling us to a closer experience of Him. We are not called just to believe in Him, nor indeed just to be in Him. We are called to feed on Him and we need fresh food every day. If you eat a chicken or a lettuce you do not become a chicken or a lettuce, you become more like what you should be. You grow and stay alive because the food is broken down and becomes nutritious building material for you. Jesus does not make us into clones of Himself or turn us into robots who obey His every command. He gives us new life and makes us more like ourselves. We are each a unique creation and he is calling us into our own relationship with him.

Dear Heavenly Father, your Word tells us that eternal life is knowing you and the Lord Jesus Christ whom you have sent to be my Lord and Saviour. Father, I want to know more of you.

Help me to know you more and to love you better. I pray that I may learn to spend more time simply sitting at your feet, listening to your Word and communing with you in your presence.

I pray that you will teach me your ways and draw me every closer to yourself, so that I may grow into the person you want me to be. Amen
