This week I am so grateful for lovely colleagues and our church families who have stepped in to help when I tested positive for Covid on Tuesday. We are very fortunate to have such a great team who are covering baptisms (thanks Phil), Sunday services (thanks Jonathan and Olive), YouTube/Red Kite service (thanks Harriet) schools ministry (thanks Open the Book team), and who have offered our family support as we have isolated (thanks churchwardens and church families). I have been feeling fairly awful for a couple of days (despite being double vaccinated) so I encourage us all to continue to take sensible precautions as we go about our daily lives.

Our Benefice Study groups met on Monday to look at 'pausing and rejoicing' in prayer, which is session two of the course. Grieg looks at the importance of pausing and stilling ourselves as part of our prayer lives, which is something that all of us struggle with as we go about our busy lives. He encourages us to use a 'centring prayer':

- 1. Find somewhere comfortable to sit, back well supported, feet flat on the floor, hands comfortably in your lap.
- 2. Begin with three deep breaths in through the nose and out through the mouth then move to breathing normally.
- 3. As you breath in and out you may like to include a prayer word or phrase such as 'our father in heaven' on the in breath and 'hallowed be your name' on the out breath.
- 4. Do this for a few minutes and then move into your normal prayer time or you may like to continue like this for longer as your prayer time.

Don't worry if you get distracted as this is normal just refocus your mind on your breathing, the feel of your feet on the floor or your prayer word or phrase.
