Mark 6:30-34, 53-56

- 6:30 The apostles gathered around Jesus, and told him all that they had done and taught.
- 6:31 He said to them, "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while." For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat.
- 6:32 And they went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves.
- 6:33 Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they hurried there on foot from all the towns and arrived ahead of them.
- 6:34 As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things.
- 6:53 When they had crossed over, they came to land at Gennesaret and moored the boat.
- 6:54 When they got out of the boat, people at once recognized him,
- 6:55 and rushed about that whole region and began to bring the sick on mats to wherever they heard he was.
- 6:56 And wherever he went, into villages or cities or farms, they laid the sick in the marketplaces, and begged him that they might touch even the fringe of his cloak; and all who touched it were healed.

The twelve disciples returned from their preaching journey and reported to Jesus all that had happened. They had been entrusted with the precious good news about the Kingdom of God, as the church is today.

Then, because they were tired, they crossed the sea by boat, hoping to find a solitary place and time alone with Jesus, which is so very important. But the crowds saw them leave and ran around by the shore, and were waiting for them. Their hunger for answers, their thirst for reality was too much for all these people, stronger than their desire for an evening meal.

People today are still hungry for answers,

As tired as Jesus undoubtedly was, he was stirred by compassion for the crowd. They were like sheep without a shepherd. People need a shepherd to care for them, to answer their questions. They needed Jesus and he did not let them down. He began to teach them many things. He came into the world to pour himself out in service for others. These verses shows as such an important feature at the heart of Jesus that he is never unavailable.

If he had such endless compassion for people then, we can be sure that he has now. Jesus was there for them when they needed him. Jesus has the same great compassion for people now as he always had. His enthronement in heaven has not made him more distant but even more accessible to everybody.

We don't have to run away to a solitary place to speak to him. All of us can speak to him right now, wherever we are and have his undivided attention. He is never out of the office or away on holiday, or in a meeting. Whenever anybody comes to Him, we find that he has tireless compassion.
