This **spectacular and romantic** mid-18th-century church is built in the 'Gothic' style. The church was built between 1753 and 1755 to a design by <u>Henry</u> <u>Keene</u> for <u>Sir William Lee</u>. It has two towers and **sits in the landscaped grounds of Hartwell House**, now a luxurious country hotel. Henry Keene designed the church for Sir William Lee. It is octagonal with east and west towers, and is thought to echo the chapter house at York Minster.

There are trees in the churchyard at Stone that need work on them to keep them safe and the quote was over £3000 and we don't have that sort of money.

We looked at ways of getting funding and one of the contractors working for HS2 have answered our prayers.

They came and looked at the work that was needed but couldn't commit to doing the actual work so have offered to cover the cost of the work for us.

Our thanks go to Coombes Forestry and HS2 for all the help and support. A Faculty has been granted
