- We recommend that worshippers still add their name and phone number to a "track and trace" form, or log into the NHS Track and Trace app. This information will be kept for 3 weeks after each service

Once case rates have come down to a lower level, we will review this further RS

#### John 6:24-35

- <sup>24</sup> Once the crowd realized that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they got into the boats and went to Capernaum in search of Jesus.
- <sup>25</sup> When they found him on the other side of the lake, they asked him, "Rabbi, when did you get here?"
- <sup>26</sup> Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw the signs I performed but because you ate the loaves and had your fill. <sup>27</sup> Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him God the Father has placed his seal of approval."
- <sup>28</sup> Then they asked him, "What must we do to do the works God requires?"
- <sup>29</sup> Jesus answered, "The work of God is this: to believe in the one he has sent."

Do you have a fussy eater in your family? Or maybe you are one yourself? We all have particular likes and dislikes at meal times, and some of us may have food allergies or intolerances.

Just the other day I was telling a younger family member how school meals used to be when I was at primary school. There were no food choices at dinner time. It was a set meal served up on a plate and we were expected to eat it all. Of course there was also a lot of discrete swapping of food from plate to plate when the dinner ladies were not looking, and everybody wanted to sit next to someone who would eat their brussels sprouts for them!

In the gospel reading today Jesus talks about bread from heaven. This is not physical food we can eat in the usual way, it is far more satisfying than that because it nourishes our spiritual hunger. Not only that but it is also to everybody's taste so there is no waste! There is an endless supply of bread from heaven because it is our Father in heaven who provides it all. He had already shown his faithfulness by supplying fresh manna from heaven each day when the people of Israel were in the wilderness.

In his son Jesus Christ our Heavenly Father has made the ultimate provision for all our spiritual needs. Jesus says 'I am the bread of life. Whoever **comes to me** will never go hungry, and whoever **believes in me** will never be thirsty'. So let's **come to him** and **believe in him** today. He is all we need.
