A message of hope from the Queen

This message from the Queen was delivered by Prince Edward to the new General Synod:

"Of all the tasks before the new Synod, one stands out supreme: to bring the people of this country to the knowledge and the love of God."

"Of course, in our richly diverse modern society, the well-being of the nation depends on the contribution of people of all faiths, and of none. But for people of faith, the last few years have been particularly hard, with unprecedented restrictions in accessing the comfort and reassurance of public worship. For many, it has been a time of anxiety, of grief, and of weariness.

"Yet the gospel has brought hope, as it has done throughout the ages; and the Church has adapted and continued its ministry, often in new ways — such as digital forms of worship."

"This Synod, like many before it, had inherited weighty responsibilities, and disagreement was inevitable. In some areas, there will, of course, be differing views, and my hope is that you will be strengthened with the certainty of the love of God, as you work together and draw on the Church's tradition of unity in fellowship for the tasks ahead."

Her Majesty the Queen ended by assuring members of her prayers for their deliberations.
