Our rector writes

'How to Pray: a guide for normal people' study group

We began our new study group on Monday evening considering Pete Greig's new book 'How to Pray'. We began by considering our own prayer lives, which types of prayer we find easy (praying on our own) and which we find more difficult (praying in front of others). We considered the concept of 'thin places', an ancient Celtic understanding of places that the Holy Spirit can saturate. The island of Iona would be an example. But Pete encourages us in the book to consider how a particular chair in our houses, a bench in the park, ten minutes on the daily commute could become a 'thin place' that helps to focus our prayer and give us a space to meet with God.

Next time we will be looking at chapters 3 and 4 of the book and the invitation to pause as a prelude to prayer. I have set the group the task of finding 5-10 minutes each day to sit quietly with God, no words, just peace and stillness and then report back their experience.
