¹⁷ Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows. ¹⁸ He chose to give us birth through the word of truth that we might be a kind of first fruits of all he created.

¹⁹ My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, ²⁰ because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires. ²¹ Therefore, get rid of all moral filth and the evil that is so prevalent and humbly accept the word planted in you, which can save you.

²² Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. ²³ Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror ²⁴ and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. ²⁵ But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do.

²⁶ Those who consider themselves religious and yet do not keep a tight rein on their tongues deceive themselves, and their religion is worthless²⁷ Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.



Heavenly Father, I give you thanks for all you have done for me; for your many good gifts and blessings and for your Word of Truth and the wisdom it contains. Help me to live my life in close communion with Christ so that my Christian religion may be pure and undefiled in your sight. I pray that the words of my mouth may always be gracious, and that the works of my hands may be carried out to your praise and glory - so that my life becomes a reflection of Christ in me, the hope of glory. What has the rector been up to?

It was always a mystery to me before I was a vicar as to what our minister was up to. I knew that their diary was frequently very 'full', but I did know what it was full of. So, I thought from time to time I would give you a little insight into some of the things that I and others in the ministry team get up to.

The last couple of weeks, whilst Phil was away, I have been preparing a mini sermon series on Ephesians for our YouTube service weekly (Phil kindly did the same for me whilst I was away on holiday) which needs to be recorded and uploaded to YouTube. We have also been preparing for and welcoming Harriet as our new house for duty minister which involves meetings and correspondence with the bishops and archdeacon and the preparing of paperwork such as offer letters, draft terms of service and a role description.

Often the ministry team is engaged in activities which are confidential, so it is not possible to share what we have been doing, which has been happening in the last few weeks. Activities related to safeguarding and some pastoral visiting would come under the confidential umbrella. These activities can often be (rightly) very time consuming and leave little time for answering emails or dealing with administration.

One of the great joys of my role is pastoral ministry visiting people, creating and sustaining relationships in the community, coming alongside those who have been bereaved or are struggling with a particular problem. I have been doing lots of visiting of people in our churches over the last few months which has been such a blessing

When ministry and life is very 'full' I like to remind myself that 'I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me' (Philippians 4:13)
