There has been further significant progress on the building works this week. The cesspit tank has been installed on a concrete foundation, and a short service of recommittal of the human remains was held. Also, the holes in the church wall for the drains serving the new kitchen and toilet area have been completed ready for connection to the tank. Work to remove the screen around the old kitchen area is also starting.

Although there is still some way to go with the project, there is much to give thanks to God for – particularly that the most uncertain part of the project (the excavation for the tank) has not encountered significant delays or complications.


Our Rector writes.....

This season always gives me a new sense of appreciation of the many unsung and sometimes unappreciated saints of our churches, those who have served God faithful in our churches and the wider community in the past and in the present. It is a good opportunity to say thank you to everyone we come across in our churches and communities for the gift of their time, energy and skills. So, thank you for all you do, for all the time and resources you gift sacrificially to serve God and his Kingdom and may God richly bless you in all you do in His name.

Advent reading

As you may have gathered by now, I love the seasons of the Church's year and the opportunity that they give to refocus our discipleship, growing into the likeness of Jesus through study, reflection and prayer. I particularly like the study resources available for Advent. This year I am going to read 'Music of Eternity' by Robyn Wrigley-Carr which is the Archbishop of York's Advent Book for this year. The meditations for each are based on the writings of Evelyn Underhill. The book focusses on how we focus on God's 'comings to us' so that we can be transformed by them as we seek to be more like Christ.



If this isn't your cup of tea then two other Advent books that I would recommend are: 'The One True Light: daily readings for Advent from the Gospel of John' by Tim Chester which explores the wonderful John 1: 1-18 reading used at Christmas offering thought provoking insights; and 'Do Nothing Christmas is Coming' by Stephen Cottrell which offers short, practical steps to slow down and take time out to be with God in the often frenetic rush to prepare for Christmas.
