John 2: 13-22

<sup>13</sup> When it was almost time for the Jewish Passover, Jesus went up to Jerusalem.
<sup>14</sup> In the temple courts he found people selling cattle, sheep and doves, and others sitting at tables exchanging money. <sup>15</sup> So he made a whip out of cords, and drove all from the temple courts, both sheep and cattle; he scattered the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. <sup>16</sup> To those who sold doves he said, "Get these out of here! Stop turning my Father's house into a market!" <sup>17</sup> His disciples remembered that it is written: "Zeal for your house will consume me."

<sup>18</sup> The Jews then responded to him, "What sign can you show us to prove your authority to do all this?"

<sup>19</sup> Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days."

<sup>20</sup> They replied, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and you are going to raise it in three days?" <sup>21</sup> But the temple he had spoken of was his body. <sup>22</sup> After he was raised from the dead, his disciples recalled what he had said. Then they believed the scripture and the words that Jesus had spoken.

Do you recognize these signs?







The first usually comes with a brown parcel on your doorstep. If you ignore the second whilst driving, your car will rapidly fill up with water. If you disobey the third, you can expect an invitation to a speed awareness course. We immediately recognize these signs and the authority which lies behind them. We have come to trust the brand.

In most places in the four gospels, the word translated as "miracle" means a sign, a token, a mark – in other words, something which is evidence that God is at work. Earlier in this chapter of John's gospel, Jesus changes water into wine at a wedding feast in Cana, which is described as the first of his miracles. In this passage, which probably took place quite some time later, Jesus puts right an injustice. The temple court was the nearest place to the holiest part of the temple in Jerusalem that non-Jews were allowed to go to worship God. This area had been taken over by traders

selling animals for sacrifice and those who sold the special coins used for temple offerings. This excluded people from worship and Jesus responded by throwing out the traders. The temple authorities confronted Jesus and demanded a sign (miracle) to prove that he had the right to do this. Jesus gives an answer which seems puzzling, but, as John points out, was the most powerful sign of all – his death and resurrection.

As followers of Jesus, we carry his mark, his logo. Some of us may do that externally by wearing a cross for instance. But how else may others recognize from our character, our actions and our words the signs that "God is at work here"? We may not change water into wine, but is God calling us to respond to injustice or be an advocate for those who are excluded.
