Jesus is speaking......

¹² 'I have much more to say to you, more than you can now bear. ¹³ But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come. ¹⁴ He will glorify me because it is from me that he will receive what he will make known to you. ¹⁵ All that belongs to the Father is mine. That is why I said the Spirit will receive from.me what he will make known to you.'

In the church calendar Trinity Sunday is the first Sunday after Pentecost and that is today. It is a special Sunday in its own right because it makes us think about who God is—the Trinity of Father, Son, and Spirit. Yet even the most committed Christians find this hard to understand because we all know that something cannot be individually three and also completely one. This Sunday expresses and celebrates the fact that in encountering God we simply run out of words to define Him. Human language and thoughts just do not work. The Bible Reading Fellowship (BRF) offers the following:

'The doctrine of the Trinity is one of the mysteries of the Christian Faith that no amount of clever analogies or explanations can quite unravel. How one can be three and three can be one has puzzled the minds of some of the greatest saints! Indeed it is certainly a stumbling-block for those of other monotheistic faiths who (quite understandably) claim that Christians believe in three gods and not one. It is probably best simply to accept that there are some things – indeed many things – about our faith that are more than our human minds can take in'

So there you have it. If you are struggling with this whole concept you are not alone. Just love Him and enjoy Him however you encounter Him. Our minds are just not big enough for anything more!



O God the Father, we thank you that you are a creator God. We thank you that you have made all things and have made them well. That you have given to us all things richly to enjoy. For the beauty and the bounty of this fair earth we thank you Father.

O Lord Jesus Christ, the Son, we thank you for your redeeming power. We thank you too because you love us with a never ending love. We see your love shown most clearly on the cross where you gave your life to conquer sin and death.

O Holy Spirit of God we thank you that you are with us at all times and in all places. For the guidance which you give to us, for the knowledge which you have given to us for your continual upholding, strengthening and protecting power. We thank you that you are with us Spirit of God.
