John 15:9-17

9 'As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. 10 If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in his love. 11 I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. 12 My command is this: love each other as I have loved you. 13 Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends. 14 You are my friends if you do what I command. 15 I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. 16 You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit – fruit that will last – and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you. 17 This is my command: love each other.

This reading includes the great commandment of Jesus that we should love one another, that just as he laid down his own life for us, so there is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends. We often hear this quoted on Remembrance Sunday.

As followers of Jesus we are privileged to be called his friends (v14). How amazing is that! We are called to be friends of Jesus, the Son of Almighty God! However, the friendship that Jesus asks of us is costly. It means loving and caring and being concerned for each other with our whole being and without limit. This applies every day, not just on Sundays; and it applies all day, not just when we can spare the time in our busy schedules. This is how it is for soldiers in the frontline in the battlefield.

On this Remembrance Sunday we gather with our poppies and reflect on some of the most challenging times in our nation's history. We remember two world wars and other conflicts since then, and we give special thanks for all of those men who gave their lives so that we could live in peace. Willingly or not, they made the ultimate sacrifice that Jesus spoke about in v13, and we do well to continue to give thanks and to honour them.

Posada 2022

Advent is a special time in the church calendar when we prepare for the coming of Jesus. Despite the hustle and bustle that is going on around us in the outside world it is a period for us in the church to reflect and wait.

Our annual Posada begins in two weeks' time on Advent Sunday, and it helps us as a church community to reflect and prepare for Jesus together. During the Posada our figures of Mary and Joseph stay with a different host household each night before moving on. As well as receiving Mary and Joseph at a pre-arranged time participants take them on to the next host also at a pre-arranged time. We are in effect ministering to one another in this way. To do this the deliverer and the receiver need to be willing to spend a few minutes together at the handover. It may be someone you know, but it might not be. That can be part of the fun of it. The handover procedure involves some simple prayers that are already written down for you to say together.

Some of you will have taken part in the Posada before, and for others this will be new. It is open to all ages – young and old.
