Matthew 1:18-24

Joseph Accepts Jesus as His Son

¹⁸ This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

²⁰ But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus because he will save his people from their sins."

²² All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had said through the prophet: ²³ "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel (which means "God with us").

²⁴ When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife.

I have always sympathised with Joseph. What was he to think? and what should he do for the best? To understand his dilemma we need to consider the marriage customs of the day which involved two separate stages.

First came the betrothal, a marriage contract that could be broken only by divorce. That was followed by a second step considerably later, often including a marriage feast, after which the groom took his wife to his home. However, the drama of our text took place between the two events. The first step had taken place; the second was in jeopardy. Joseph's reaction when he heard that Mary was pregnant was to suspect her of adultery - one of the grounds for divorce in Jewish law. However, following the visit from the angel he took Mary into his home as his wife, and then after the child was born, he named the child "Jesus" in obedience to the command.

We know very little about Joseph after Jesus was born but we do know he was faithful to the law and obedient to God, that he accepted Jesus as his son, and cared for him in the best way he could. A guiet hero.



Gracious God

You chose Mary to be the mother of the promised saviour, and Joseph to raise him as his own son.

Fill us with your grace, that like Mary we might rejoice in your salvation, and like Joseph be faithful and obedient to your will.

Send us out to finish our Advent journey filled with love and joy and peace ready to receive you into our hearts this Christmas.
