As we continue to mourn our beloved Queen, we give thanks today for the accession to the throne of His Majesty King Charles III.

The world and our nation face multiple challenges. We give thanks to God that we have a new King who will bring stability, wisdom and deep Christian faith to his unique role. King Charles has prepared through the whole of his life for the office he will now fulfil.

In his moving address to the nation on 9 September, the King pledged himself afresh to the service of the nation and commonwealth. In turn, we pledge to him our continued loyalty and our prayers for our King, the Queen Consort, the Prince and Princess of Wales and the Royal Family in all of their responsibilities.

Our set readings for today are: Amos 8:4-7, 1 Timothy 2:1-7 and Luke 16:1-13 The reading from the epistle seems to be particularly appropriate today.

1 Timothy 2:1-7 Instructions on worship

1 I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people – 2 for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. 3 This is good, and pleases God our Saviour, 4 who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. 5 For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus, 6 who gave himself as a ransom for all people. This has now been witnessed to at the proper time. 7 And for this purpose I was appointed a herald and an apostle – I am telling the truth, I am not lying – and a true and faithful teacher of the Gentiles.

All of a sudden we have a new King as well as a new Prime Minister. Although Charles had been preparing for his new role all his life it has been thrust on him suddenly, and at a time of deep personal grief.

Our new Prime Minister Liz Truss and her cabinet ministers are faced with significant challenges at a time when many in our country are anxious about the increasing cost of living and delays in receiving health care.

We are instructed in this reading to pray for kings and all those in authority. Let us undertake to do that each day, asking that our leaders may do so with justice, mercy and walking humbly with God, just as the late Queen, did.

Excerpts from the blog of Bishop Steven

......One thread which is emerging is the profound importance of Christian faith, both to the late Queen and also to our new King. There is a sense of the nation leaning into the resources of the Christian faith as we grieve together and learn to look forward in hope.

......There will also be many people in our communities for whom the national mourning stirs afresh their own grief for loved ones who have died and who will therefore need pastoral care and draw strength from the Church.
