Luke 11:1-13

Jesus' teaching on prayer

11 One day Jesus was praying in a certain place. When he finished, one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.'

² He said to them, 'When you pray, say:

"Father,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come.

³ Give us each day our daily bread.

⁴ Forgive us our sins,
for we also forgive everyone who sins against us.
And lead us not into temptation."

⁵Then Jesus said to them, 'Suppose you have a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say, "Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; ⁶ a friend of mine on a journey has come to me, and I have no food to offer him." ⁷ And suppose the one inside answers, "Don't bother me. The door is already locked, and my children and I are in bed. I can't get up and give you anything." ⁸ I tell you, even though he will not get up and give you -++the bread because of friendship, yet because of your shameless audacity he will surely get up and give you as much as you need.

⁹ 'So I say to you: ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. ¹⁰ For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened.

¹¹ 'Which of you fathers, if your son asks for a fish, will give him a snake instead? ¹² Or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? ¹³ If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'

In reality many of us do not find prayer straightforward. The Lord's Prayer in whichever form we use it is both basic and yet complete. It says it all. Even so Jesus feels the need to go on and illustrate how much our heavenly father loves us and is wanting to give us good things. So why do we find it hard to ask?

- 1. Sometimes it is easier to believe that God only gives good things to 'more advanced' Christians and to consider ourselves unworthy of what we are asking for. Not true.
- 2. We are frightened he will not answer us, but we may just be asking for the wrong things. God already knows what is best for us. The more we get to know Him the better we will understand how much he loves us and wants to give the right things for us.

Jesus tells us to persist in prayer. Never give up seeking God, his kingdom, his righteousness, and his Holy Spirit. These things should be first on our list.
