The Cost of Being a Disciple

Luke 14:25 - 33

²⁵ Large crowds were travelling with Jesus, and turning to them he said: ²⁶ "If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters—yes, even their own life—such a person cannot be my disciple. ²⁷ And whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple.

²⁸ "Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Won't you first sit down and estimate the cost to see if you have enough money to complete it? ²⁹ For if you lay the foundation and are not able to finish it, everyone who sees it will ridicule you, ³⁰ saying 'this person began to build and wasn't able to finish.'

³¹ "Or suppose a king is about to go to war against another king. Won't he first sit down and consider whether he is able with ten thousand men to oppose the one coming against him with twenty thousand? ³² If he is not able, he will send a delegation while the other is still a long way off and will ask for terms of peace. ³³ In the same way, those of you who do not give up everything you have cannot be my disciples.

This week's Gospel reading is a hard hitting message using the Jewish practice of exaggeration to make a point. The word 'hate' in this context actually means 'love less'. It is a relative term meaning not to honour something above something else. In other words Jesus must be the absolute priority in our lives if we are to be His disciples. In this passage Jesus requires us to consider what price we are prepared to pay as Christ's disciples. Are we prepared to follow Him whatever our closest family might say? To love Him even at the cost of our own lives? Jesus wants us to understand that discipleship will cost us everything, but consider what we gain in return!



O Lord.

in the goodness of your constant love, be with the people of Pakistan as they face devastating floods.

We pray that they may find consolation in their sorrow, strength as they seek shelter and safety and courage to carry on.

At this time of great loss – loss of lives, homes and crops –may we be filled with your compassion and moved to reach out in love.

Forgive us, O Lord, for our part in the climate crisis, and inspire us all to play our part in protecting the earth, our common home.

So that together we may build a world that reflects your glory, where hope drives out despair and all things are made new.
