1 Corinthians 13

13 If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. ² If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. ³ If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing.

⁴Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. ⁵ It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. ⁶ Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. ⁷ It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

⁸Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away. ⁹ For we know in part and we prophesy in part, ¹⁰ but when completeness comes, what is in part disappears. ¹¹ When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put the ways of childhood behind me. ¹² For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.

¹³ And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.

This is one of the most beautiful and best known passages in the New Testament. Many people would recognise it as it is often read at weddings. Yet this love is far wider and deeper than that. Paul describes the love he's talking about. It is not a love of swollen feelings that may come and go. It is not the love of flowery or eloquent words. This is God's love—from the Greek *agape*—often described by Christians as "unconditional love", and it is a love which is everlasting. It is unconditional in the sense that it does not depend on the one being loved, but on the commitment of the giver – are we always patient and kind etc though? well I know I am not, even though I try! So we need God's help to love in this way.



Lord, we desperately need this kind of love in the church today. Help us to grow in love for you and for each other in the way St Paul describes. May this love be the driving force behind all our thoughts and actions. Amen
