Luke 17:11-19

Jesus heals ten men with leprosy

11 Now on his way to Jerusalem, Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. 12 As he was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy met him. They stood at a distance 13 and called out in a loud voice, 'Jesus, Master, have pity on us!'
14 When he saw them, he said, 'Go, show yourselves to the priests.' And as they went, they were cleansed.

15 One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice.

16 He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him – and he was a Samaritan.

17 Jesus asked, 'Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? 18 Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?' 19 Then he said to him, 'Rise and go; your faith has made you well.'

The <u>Prisons Week</u> theme for 2022 is 'What are you thankful for?' It is based around this passage where Jesus heals ten lepers only one of which, a Samaritan, returns to thank him.

Dear Jesus, you told the healed man to get up and go,



now I am asking you to help me go and do the same; that in this place I might carry your message of love, kindness, gratitude, forgiveness and especially compassion to all. Help me to encourage all I work with, to grow in love for you, for others and most of all for themselves, and may your kindness grow and flourish. Amen
