Mark 1:1-8 John the Baptist prepares the way

1 The beginning of the good news about Jesus the Messiah the Son of God 2 as it is written in Isaiah the prophet:

'I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way' –
³ 'a voice of one calling in the wilderness, "Prepare the way for the Lord,

make straight paths for him."'

⁴ And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptised by him in the River Jordan. ⁶ John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt round his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ And this was his message: 'After me comes the one more powerful than I, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸ I baptise you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

What was it that drew people to this mysterious man living a simple lifestyle in the Judean desert, wearing unfashionable clothes? We are told that 'all the people of Jerusalem went out to him' so they must have been desperately seeking something.

John was preaching a message of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. So he was telling them what in their heart of hearts they knew they needed. He offered them something that in the depths of their souls they were waiting for.

His message was direct and they responded to that. It was also effective because John himself was humble. He sought no fame or glory for himself. Instead he viewed himself as a servant of the one who was to come after him. The people saw a man who was not interested in money or material comforts, but who was passionate about God. They recognised his holiness, and his sincerity.

Our church here in Stone is dedicated to John the Baptist, so what can we learn from him about sharing the Good News in our own community?
