Thanks to those who give their time each month to bake, cook and serve Stone villagers and others from further afield. Naomi x



Matthew 14:22-33 Jesus Walks on the Water

²² Immediately Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead of him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowd. ²³ After he had dismissed them, he went up on a mountainside by himself to pray. Later that night, he was there alone, ²⁴ and the boat was already a considerable distance from land, buffeted by the waves because the wind was against it.

²⁵ Shortly before dawn Jesus went out to them, walking on the lake. ²⁶ When the disciples saw him walking on the lake, they were terrified. "It's a ghost," they said, and cried out in fear.

²⁷ But Jesus immediately said to them: "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid."

- ²⁸ "Lord, if it's you," Peter replied, "tell me to come to you on the water."
- ²⁹ "Come," he said.



Then Peter got down out of the boat, walked on the water and came toward Jesus. ³⁰ But when he saw the wind, he was afraid and, beginning to sink, cried out, "Lord, save me!"

³¹ Immediately Jesus reached out his hand and caught him. "You of little faith," he said, "why did you doubt?"

³² And when they climbed into the boat, the wind died down. ³³ Then those who were in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."

We have also become accustomed to hearing that 'So and so walks on water' when they have just done something tremendous that is popular too (like scoring a hat trick for England maybe?). What is it though that enables Peter to get out of the boat in the first place, and then eventually to start sinking?

When Peter stepped out of the boat he was responding to Jesus who told him to 'come'. He was putting his faith in Jesus, and keeping his eyes fixed on him he started to make his way across the water. However, he then started to pay more attention to the wind and his surroundings and so he began to panic. I expect we all know that feeling. When things start to go wrong we take our eyes off Jesus.

Even though it is panic that cause Peter to pray 'Lord Save me', it is a genuine cry from the heart which Jesus recognises and responds to. Our prayers do not need to be long or eloquent. Jesus understands us and already knows what is in our heart.



Lord Jesus, help me to keep my eyes fixed on you in the midst of everything that is going on around me; and thankyou that you are always there when I call out to you. Amen
