⁶ There was a man sent from God whose name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. ⁸ He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.

John 1:19-28

John the Baptist Denies Being the Messiah

¹⁹ Now this was John's testimony when the Jewish leaders in Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him who he was. ²⁰ He did not fail to confess, but confessed freely, "I am not the Messiah."

²¹ They asked him, "Then who are you? Are you Elijah?"

He said, "I am not."

"Are you the Prophet?"

He answered, "No."

- ²² Finally they said, "Who are you? Give us an answer to take back to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?"
- ²³ John replied in the words of Isaiah the prophet, "I am the voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way for the Lord.'"
- ²⁴ Now the Pharisees who had been sent ²⁵ questioned him, "Why then do you baptise if you are not the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?"
- ²⁶ "I baptise with water," John replied, "but among you stands one you do not know.
 ²⁷ He is the one who comes after me, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie."
- ²⁸ This all happened at Bethany on the other side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.

John the Baptist was a witness to the light who understood the truth about himself and his role. He was a prophet and was in continuity with the prophets, but he was not the Messiah. His mission was to introduce Jesus and help people be ready for Jesus and to recognise him when he came.

John knew that his role was to bring people to Christ, and that is our role too. We must try to live our lives right so that people will be able to know through us that faith in Christ makes all the difference.

We need to ask the Lord to strengthen that sense of mission in our lives and to give us the grace to shine his light into the world around us – not just at Christmas, but all year round.



Lord Jesus, Light of light, you have come among us. Help us who live by your light to shine as lights in your world. Glory to God in the highest. Amen.

Gaudete Sunday

Those of us from a certain generation will remember Steeleye Span hitting the pop charts in 1973 with their rendition of 'Gaudete, Gaudete Christos est natus'. It still comes out with the Christmas collection for many today. Recently it seems to be played in Sainsbury's whenever I pop in for milk or bread, or yet more mince pies. It is surprising really that they still hit the PLAY button when they see me coming as I cannot help singing along while wandering the aisles looking for someone to sing the harmonies with me. But what is Gaudete Sunday itself all about?

It falls on the third Sunday of Advent in Catholic and mainline protestant churches. Whereas the spirit of the liturgy throughout Advent is one of expectation and preparation for the feast of Christmas - as well as for the second coming of Christ - Gaudete Sunday offers a break from this by focussing on the joy and the gladness of the good news of Christ.

'Gaudete' means 'rejoice'! so do join in with the celebration – maybe with some hearty singing at the carol service this afternoon.
