Matthew 9:35 -10:8

The workers are few

³⁵ Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and illness. ³⁶ When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. ³⁷ Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. ³⁸ Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.'

Jesus sends out the Twelve

10 Jesus called his twelve disciples to him and gave them authority to drive out impure spirits and to heal every disease and illness.

² These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon (who is called Peter) and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; ³ Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; ⁴ Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

⁵ These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: 'Do not go among the Gentiles or enter any town of the Samaritans. ⁶ Go rather to the lost sheep of Israel. ⁷ As you go, proclaim this message: "The kingdom of heaven has come near." ⁸ Heal those who are ill, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy drive out demons. Freely you have received; freely give.

There is a lot happening in this passage. Jesus is certainly busy - travelling, teaching, proclaiming, and healing. He has great compassion on all the crowds he encounters, so much so that he says 'The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few' before telling the disciples to pray for more workers. Then he sent out the twelve with instructions on what they should do. If you read on beyond the passage shown here you will see he gave very detailed instructions. His disciples have travelled with Jesus, listened to his teaching, and seen his miracles. Now they must go out and do the same. Jesus has set the pattern and the priorities and given them the authority to carry out his work. The primary message is always the same 'The kingdom of heaven has come near'.

From those first twelve there is now a worldwide church of Jesus' disciples continuing to pray for more workers and proclaiming God's kingdom. Here in SJB alone there are already more than twelve of us so let's get going!



Lord, there is such a lot of need in the world that it feels overwhelming, so we do pray that you will raise up more workers for your kingdom. Give us all compassionate hearts ready to go and serve others, and help us to proclaim your kingdom in our own community here in Stone. Amen
