Coffee Cup news



Matthew 16:13-20

Peter declares that Jesus is the Messiah

- ¹³ When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?'
- ¹⁴ They replied, 'Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets.'
- ¹⁵ 'But what about you?' he asked. 'Who do you say I am?'
- ¹⁶ Simon Peter answered, 'You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.'
- ¹⁷ Jesus replied, 'Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my Father in heaven. ¹⁸ And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it. ¹⁹ I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.' ²⁰ Then he ordered his disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah.

Jesus and His disciples are in the region of Caesarea Philippi just north of Galilee, It was an area full of worship of false gods including the Greek god Pan. There was even a temple outside a cave devoted to Pan. Jesus therefore deliberately asked 'who do people say the Son of Man is?' and it is clear from the answers the disciples gave that the people thought he might be one of the former prophets.

Jesus' follow up question then gets to the heart of the disciples' understanding of who Jesus is and why He came. It is also an important question for all of us individually and together as a church. Jesus asked 'who do YOU say I am?' It is the most important question.

In a place devoted to a pagan god, and with religious leaders rejecting Jesus, Peter announced "You are the Christ, the Messiah, the Anointed One! You are the Son of the living God!"

Peter didn't always get it right, but he got it right this time. Jesus is the Messiah and He is the Son of God! He isn't just a good teacher, He isn't just a miracle worker, He isn't just another one of 'a number of ways to God'. He is the Christ and the Son of God. Peter understood this and we must as well in order to make sense of our Christian faith. Jesus was speaking to his followers in the context of Jewish history and culture, but society around us today is equally confused by false Gods and theories.

So - who do YOU say Jesus is when people ask you?



Dear Lord Jesus, Son of God, thankyou that you are more than just a good teacher. You have brought us into a true relationship with our Heavenly Father. Help us to serve your church and to always be ready to share this good news with others. Amen.
