

Matthew 5:1-12

5 Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, ² and he began to teach them.

He said:

3 "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

4 Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

5 Blessed are the meek,

for they will inherit the earth.

6 Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness,

for they will be filled.

7 Blessed are the merciful.

for they will be shown mercy.

8 Blessed are the pure in heart,

for they will see God.

9 Blessed are the peacemakers,

for they will be called children of God.

10 Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness,

for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

11 "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. 12 Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.



As even more people flocked to hear Jesus speak, the group grew into a great crowd. The fact that so many people were drawn to Jesus illustrates their longing for direction, their need for something more in life, and Jesus recognised and responded to this. In this passage Jesus is painting a picture of what His kingdom is like.

The Sermon on the Mount focuses on internal changes. It focuses on what is inside our hearts, and how we demonstrate these character qualities as followers of Jesus. Our actions alone are not enough to save us (though the religious leaders of the time were saying they did). It is what is inside our hearts that matters to God. It is those internal changes that cause us to act in certain ways and not in others. True change comes from within when we take Jesus' words to heart and let his love shine through us.



Lord, help me to live by the values of the Sermon on the Mount and to be characterised by the Beatitudes, so I might be a light to the world around me. Amen
