BELONG - BELIEVE - BUILD - WITH CHRIST AS THE CORNERSTONE

This week we met for the final session of our Lent study course about Peter the disciple. Many thanks to Phil, Richard, and David who guided our discussions. Also to Clare and Terry for their hospitality so we were able to meet in comfort. Our pewsheet reflection has been prepared for us by Richard who led our final study evening. The only way is up!

John 21:1-25

Following his threefold denial of Jesus, Peter must have felt that there was no way back to being a disciple of Jesus. Jesus' original call to Peter, James and John came after a night's unsuccessful fishing, and the token of Jesus' call was an enormous catch of fish (Luke 5:1-11). Now without a leader, the obvious course for the disciples was to go back to their original work as fishermen, this time accompanied by four other disciples. After another unsuccessful night's fishing, they probably felt that the last thing they needed was someone on the shore telling them how to do their job. It was only when they landed another huge catch that they recognized that Jesus was calling them again. Even then, it was John, rather than Peter who made the connection.

Following a breakfast of bread and fish (a memory of the feeding of the 5000?), Jesus addresses Peter directly using Peter's original name, Simon (which means "one who listens"). Jesus asks the question: "Simon son of John, do you love me?" The English translation gives the impression that Jesus asked the same question three times and Peter gave the same answer each time. However, in the Greek, two different words for love are used. *Agape* means self-giving love (as God loved the world in sending his Son), whilst *philo* means the affection that dear friends hold for each other. On the first two occasions, Jesus asks "Simon, do you love me as God loves?" to which Peter replies "You know that I love you as a dear friend". The third time, Jesus asks "Simon, do you even love me as a dear friend?" That must have brought back the painful memory of his denials.

Yet, Jesus did not ask these questions simply to make Peter feel sorry for denying him. Following each question and Peter's answers, Jesus symbolically hands over to Peter the care of his most precious possessions – his followers. Jesus had earlier declared himself to be the Good Shepherd (John 10:14-18). The common human response would be "once bitten, twice shy", and the instinct to trust Peter less than before. Instead, Jesus not only forgives Peter's failure, but trusts him more.

Little surprise then that John, the author of this gospel later writes these words: "My dear children, I write this to you so that you will not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have one who speaks to the Father in our defence, Jesus Christ" (I John 2:1). There is a way back from deep failure.
