



### Luke 2:15-21

15 When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, 'Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about.'

16 So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. 17 When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, 18 and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. 19 But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. 20 The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

21 On the eighth day, when it was time to circumcise the child, he was named Jesus, the name the angel had given him before he was conceived.



When we receive some good news, especially if it is unexpected, we just naturally want to share it with others – don't we? The shepherds certainly did. First of all the angel told the shepherds the good news. Then, because the news was so good the shepherds just could not keep it to themselves. They went out and told others all about it too. They did not have any formal evangelism training (as far as we know!), they just repeated what they had heard and seen. That is all that witnessing is really. We might not know the answers to deep theological questions, but we know what we have seen and heard. So, if we have just celebrated the good news of our saviour Jesus Christ we need to rejoice and share it with others. Perhaps that could be a New Year resolution?

This is a shortened version of a prayer from Billy Graham written in 2008 but it is just as relevant as we look toward 2024.



Our Father and our God, as we stand at the beginning of this new year we confess our need of your presence and Your guidance as we face the future.

We each have our hopes and expectations for the year that is ahead of us—but you alone know what it holds for us, and only You can give us the strength and the wisdom we will need to meet its challenges. So help us to humbly put our hands into your hand, and to trust You and to seek Your will for our lives during this coming year.

In the midst of life's uncertainties in the days ahead, assure us of the certainty of your unchanging love.

In the midst of life's inevitable disappointments and heartaches, help us to turn to you for the stability and comfort we will need.

In the midst of life's temptations and the pull of our stubborn self-will, help us not to lose our way but to have the courage to do what is right in your sight, regardless of the cost.

And so, Father, we thank you for the promise and hope of this new year, and we look forward to it with expectancy and faith. This we ask in the name of our Lord and Saviour, who by His death and resurrection has given us hope both for this world and the world to come.
