Matthew 16:21-28

Jesus Predicts His Death

- ²¹ From that time on Jesus began to explain to his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things at the hands of the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life.
- ²² Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. "Never, Lord!" he said. "This shall never happen to you!"
- ²³ Jesus turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; you do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns."
- ²⁴ Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ²⁵ For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it. ²⁶ What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? ²⁷ For the Son of Man is going to come in his Father's glory with his angels, and then he will reward each person according to what they have done.
- ²⁸ "Truly I tell you, some who are standing here will not taste death before they see the Son of Man coming in his kingdom."

The words of Jesus in this passage are tremendously powerful. He is talking about the heart of his mission and it has huge implications for everyone who follows Him. We are not to seek a life of comfort and security because following Jesus means denying ourselves in order to go where He leads us. Having a purpose in life is far more important and fulfilling than having wealth and possessions.

The bottom line is this – in every key decision we make we need to ask ourselves whether we have in mind the concerns of God, or the concerns of man? If you follow Jesus and surrender your life to Him you will find a new life – with life in all its fullness.
