Matthew 28:16 - 20 The great commission

¹⁶ Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. ¹⁷ When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted. ¹⁸ Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.'



Matthews Gospel closes back in Galilee where Jesus had called his first disciples. It is rather like a final scene in an epic film but it is actually the beginning of the next stage of the great mission that still continues around the world today '.....go and make disciples of all nations.....' Notice also that although Jesus did not use the term 'Trinity' he does instruct the disciples to baptise' in the name of the Father and of the Son and the Holy Spirit'.

In fact the word Trinity is not found in the Bible at all, but the belief it expresses is stated many times. The early Christians soon discovered they could not speak of God without speaking of the three ways in which he reveals himself to us. It does not mean there are three separate Gods.

Trinity Sunday is a special Sunday because it makes us think about who God is. Even the most committed or 'spiritual' Christians find this hard because we all know that something cannot be individually three and also completely one. Our knowledge of God is imperfect for now, but one day we will see Him face to face, and then we will understand.



God in three persons, blessed Trinity, on this special day, we have come before you to offer our praise and adoration, even though we do not understand all the mysteries of who you are.

You are God, the creator, giving us richly all things to enjoy.

You are Christ the Saviour of the world, made flesh to set us free.

You are the Spirit of truth and love, willing to dwell in us, to refine and renew us, and to give us your peace.

Send us out in the power of your Spirit to fulfil the great commission you have called us to. In Jesus' name.

Rotten pulpit – but not for long

The wooden floor of the pulpit has been spongy for a while and when we investigated we found the wooden frame on which the floor sits was rotten and with no real support. Later on this month a carpenter will be making a new frame and replacing the original oak floor, making the pulpit good as new. Then next month he will put a hand rail up to the pulpit and one by the porch door into the body of the church. Keep your eyes open for these improvements.

Did you know – the pulpit has been in place since 1897 when it was dedicated to Queen Victoria?

The plaque beneath it reads:

TO THE GLORY OF GOD AND IN COMMEMORATION OF THE SIXTIETH YEAR OF THE REIGN OF HER MOST GRACIOUS MAJESTY QUEEN VICTORIA. THIS PULPIT WAS PLACED IN THIS CHURCH OF ST JOHN BAPTIST STONE BY THE PARISHIONERS AD 1897
