

#### Matthew 5:13-20

#### Salt and Light

<sup>13</sup> "You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot.

<sup>14</sup> "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. <sup>15</sup> Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. <sup>16</sup> In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.

#### The Fulfilment of the Law

<sup>17</sup> "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfil them. <sup>18</sup> For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth disappear, not the smallest letter, not the least stroke of a pen, will by any means disappear from the Law until everything is accomplished. <sup>19</sup> Therefore anyone who sets aside one of the least of these commands and teaches others accordingly will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever practices and teaches these commands will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. <sup>20</sup> For I tell you that unless your righteousness surpasses that of the Pharisees and the teachers of the law, you will certainly not enter the kingdom of heaven.

Christians are called to change things in the world and point the way to Jesus; we can impact the world for Christ in amazing ways when we follow Him.



Salt has lots of uses. It used to be used as currency, as valuable as gold. It was also used as a preservative because it kept things fresh before refrigeration came in. It can alter chemistry in cooking and even keep roads from freezing. Nowadays though we appreciate it most for its flavour. Just a tiny amount can make a big difference to what we eat.

As followers of Jesus we are called to have an impact on our community, enhancing it for the better. This is why Jesus refers to us as the salt of the earth.



So if we huddle together in church or inside our own faith and do not share it with others, it is useless. Does a candle lose any of its flame by lighting another candle? No, by sharing its flame with other candles it can light up a whole room.

Then in verses 17-20 we see a conclusion of sorts to what Jesus is teaching. He explains that he does not want to abolish the law or the prophets but to fulfil them. He is the light of the world and he shares that light with us. It is

now our responsibility to share it with others.

One way in which SJB tries to 'get out of the saltshaker' and into our community is through Café in the Park – and yesterday it was buzzing! Thankyou to everyone who helped. Our next Saturday Café will be on  $4^{th}$  March but it is also open EVERY Tuesday 11:00-1:00. So if you haven't been along yet there are plenty of opportunities to do so. Father we pray that You will use us in this community where You have placed us, to bring the light, the life, and the love of Christ to those we meet in our daily lives. Keep us ever mindful that without You we can do nothing, but in the strength and power of Your Holy Spirit, we are able to act as Your hands, Your feet, and Your heart, to those in need. In Jesus' name we pray, AMEN.
