John 14:1-14

Jesus comforts his disciples

14 'Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me. ² My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? ³ And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am. ⁴ You know the way to the place where I am going.'

Jesus the way to the Father

- ⁵ Thomas said to him, 'Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?'
- ⁶ Jesus answered, 'I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. ⁷ If you really know me, you will know my Father as well. From now on, you do know him and have seen him.'
- ⁸ Philip said, 'Lord, show us the Father and that will be enough for us.'
- ⁹ Jesus answered: 'Don't you know me, Philip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, "Show us the Father"? ¹⁰ Don't you believe that I am in the Father, and that the Father is in me? The words I say to you I do not speak on my own authority. Rather, it is the Father, living in me, who is doing his work. ¹¹ Believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; or at least believe on the evidence of the works themselves. ¹² Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. ¹³ And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. ¹⁴ You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it.

This passage follows Jesus telling Peter he will deny him. The disciples were also becoming aware of the mounting peril to Jesus at this time. No wonder their hearts were troubled. We all have times when our hearts are troubled, even Jesus. In the earlier chapters of John's gospel there are three occasions when Jesus was 'deeply troubled in spirit', so we should not expect to be confident and cheerful all the time. However, Jesus offers these comforting thoughts:

- 1. 'You believe in God; believe also in me'. Jesus is reminding his disciples that in the past they have trusted in the promises of God. In the same way they can now put their trust in him because 'I am in the Father and the Father is in me'.
- 2. Although Jesus will leave them soon he is preparing a place for his disciples and promises to come back for them. He is preparing a place for all who love him and we will be with him forever in his kingdom.

This passage is often read as words of comfort at funeral services, but they are words of comfort and reassurance to us now. Thankyou Jesus.

Thy Kingdom Come
