³⁵ Then Jesus declared, 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.

John 6:41-51

41 At this the Jews there began to grumble about him because he said, 'I am the bread that came down from heaven.' 42 They said, 'Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, "I came down from heaven"?'

43 'Stop grumbling among yourselves,' Jesus answered. 44 'No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws them, and I will raise them up at the last day. 45 It is written in the Prophets: "They will all be taught by God." Unpacking the Bible

We have had a number of requests recently from church members for an opportunity to find out more about the Bible. Although we have readings from the Bible and a message based on those readings at all of our services, there may not be time to answer the questions that arise from the readings, or to do justice to the narratives and themes of the Bible during services. Also, not everyone who is interested in exploring the Bible is able to attend church services.

During the Autumn, Phil Groves and Richard Smith will be leading fortnightly sessions on a Thursday evening at 8pm starting on 12th September. The sessions are open to those of any faith or none and aim to stimulate discussion rather than to provide all the answers. The programme outline is as follows:

September 12th: How did the Old Testament come to us in its present form? (Phil Groves)

September 26th, October 10th and 24th: Power and politics: have we learned anything in 3000 years? A dip into the books of Kings. (Richard Smith)

November 7th: How did the New Testament come to us in its present form? (Phil Groves)

November 21st and December 5th: The life and teaching of Jesus in a nutshell: the Gospel of Mark. (Phil Groves)

A prayer for unity in our communities

Following the recent wave of violence and disorder across the UK, the Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby said last weekend "I also want to thank churches and other faith groups around the country who are doing such vital work to care for their communities and bring people together. As Christians we remember Christ's command to love our neighbour – that is especially vital at this time".



"Lord God. At this time of unrest, we ask for your spirit to bring unity to our communities. For those who feel anxious, scared or intimidated – we ask you to fill them with your peace. For those who feel unwanted, abandoned or alone – we pray that you would fill them with your love. For those who feel in despair – we ask you to bring your hope.

We pray for all emergency workers at this time. For the police officers charged with keeping people safe and maintaining order; for the paramedics caring for those who are injured; and for the fire fighters responding to acts of arson and vandalism. Protect them from harm. Help them act with courage in the face of aggression and with restraint in the face of hostility.

We pray for our politicians and community leaders. That they would have the wisdom to know how to bring our communities together at this time in hope, love and reconciliation.

We pray for those causing disorder on the streets, that they will turn from darkness and hate, to be responsible upstanding citizens of their country. Fill this land with your spirit of peace we pray."
