
## **Hymns & Pimms!**

#### Peter Declares That Jesus Is the Messiah

<sup>27</sup> Jesus and his disciples went on to the villages around Caesarea Philippi. On the way he asked them, "Who do people say I am?"

<sup>28</sup> They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets."

<sup>29</sup> "But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?" Peter answered, "You are the Messiah."

<sup>30</sup> Jesus warned them not to tell anyone about him.

#### Jesus Predicts His Death

<sup>31</sup> He then began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. <sup>32</sup> He spoke plainly about this, and Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him.

<sup>33</sup> But when Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, he rebuked Peter. "Get behind me, Satan!" he said. "You do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns."

<sup>34</sup> Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. <sup>35</sup> For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and for the gospel will save it. <sup>36</sup> What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? <sup>37</sup> Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? <sup>38</sup> If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them when he comes in his Father's glory with the holy angels."

# International Centre for Eye Health (ICEH) Situated in the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Health

A big thank you to the congregation of St John the Baptist for donating the Coffee Cup Collection to the ICEH

The ICEH is a global network, delivering excellence in research, education and capacity to improve eye health worldwide through collaborative partnerships.

Low and middle-income countries experience most of the vision loss but have a fewer trained healthcare professionals to deal with the problem.

One of the programmes of the ICEH is the very successful VISION 2020 LINKS & Networks Programme, which aims to build long-term partnerships between eye care institutions in the UK and those in low and middle-income countries.

Clare Davey ran the LINK between Mulago Hospital, Kampala, Uganda and the Royal Free Hospital, London, between 2010 and 2020. As part of the LINK, a team of eye care nurses and doctors would go out for each year for several weeks with different goals each year. Improving management of glaucoma, childhood tumours, cataract surgery, diabetic retinopathy and leadership are some of the programmes we delivered. The Ugandan eye doctors and nurses would have return visits to the Royal Free, to learn about treatments here. We very much enjoyed the association, and we learned a lot and I hope that they did too!
