Matthew 9:35-38 The Workers Are Few

³⁵Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness.

³⁶ When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. ³⁷ Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. ³⁸ Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."

Matthew 10:1-8 Jesus Sends Out the Twelve

- ¹ Jesus called his twelve disciples to him and gave them authority to drive out impure spirits and to heal every disease and sickness.
- ²These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon (who is called Peter) and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; ³Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; ⁴Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.
- ⁵These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Do not go among the Gentiles or enter any town of the Samaritans. ⁶Go rather to the lost sheep of Israel. ⁷As you go, proclaim this message: 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' ⁸ Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons. Freely you have received; freely give.

Did you know?

- Father's Day has been celebrated in the UK for just over a century although it has only been officially recognised on our calendars since 1972.
- It was originally celebrated on 5th June as that is the feast day of St Boniface, the patron saint of fathers.
- Nowadays we celebrate it on the third Sunday in June, but in Australia and New Zealand it is celebrated in November.
- It was started in the US by a lady who was brought up with her siblings by her single father after their mother's death. She wanted to honour his hard work and dedication in their upbringing. She thought of the idea while listening to a sermon in church about mothers.
- Who was St Boniface? (I heard you ask). He was an English Benedictine monk, born in Devon in 675. He made it his life's mission to convert the Germanic tribes to Christianity. He is also famous for cutting down an oak tree that was being worshipped by pagans. That is a whole new story for another day.
