Responding to the findings of the Makin review

Undoubtedly the publication of the Makin Review into John Smyth's abuse, and the church's response, will have affected you all in some way.

Bishop Steven has responded to the review and the resignation of the Archbishop of Canterbury in a <u>statement available on our website</u>. He calls on us to "focus first on the survivors and victims of John Smyth and all others affected by his abuse who have suffered so much and for so long". With that in mind, we have <u>resources to support survivors</u> on our website.

The Church of England has published its own response to the report.

In his reflections, Bishop Steven quotes this passage from Romans 8.38–39:

"For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord"

The Destruction of the Temple and Signs of the End Times

13 As Jesus was leaving the temple, one of his disciples said to him, "Look, Teacher! What massive stones! What magnificent buildings!"

² "Do you see all these great buildings?" replied Jesus. "Not one stone here will be left on another; everyone will be thrown down."

³ As Jesus was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John and Andrew asked him privately, ⁴ "Tell us, when will these things happen? And what will be the sign that they are all about to be fulfilled?"

⁵ Jesus said to them: "Watch out that no one deceives you. ⁶ Many will come in my name, claiming, 'I am he,' and will deceive many. ⁷ When you hear of wars and rumours of wars, do not be alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come. ⁸ Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be earthquakes in various places, and famines. These are the beginning of birth pains.
