

John 10:11-18

The Good Shepherd

¹¹ 'I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹² The hired hand is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep. So when he sees the wolf coming, he abandons the sheep and runs away. Then the wolf attacks the flock and scatters it. ¹³ The man runs away because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep.

¹⁴ 'I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me – ¹⁵ just as the Father knows me and I know the Father – and I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶ I have other sheep that are not of this sheepfold. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd. ¹⁷ The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life – only to take it up again. ¹⁸ No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down and authority to take it up again. This command I received from my Father.'

Thy Kingdom Come

Since its beginning in 2016 Thy Kingdom Come (TKC) has become a global ecumenical prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray from Ascension to Pentecost for more people to come to know Jesus. We in SJB have taken part in TKC since the first year and we plan to do so again this year.



TKC will begin in SJB with an Ascension Day service in the evening of 9th May, and it continues until Pentecost Sunday on 19th May. The church will be open each evening 7pm – 7.30pm from Friday 10th May until Saturday 18th May. We encourage everyone to come in and pray during that time, either aloud or silently, whichever way is most comfortable for each person.

For those who prefer to pray at home we are producing our own little book of daily prayers because many people found this helpful last year.

There will also be a prayer box at Café in the Park and in the Church porch for anyone to put a prayer request in. These can be anonymous. The requests will then be included in the evening prayers in church.
