We will NOT be doing that this year as Revd Sue Smith has said that due to your generosity in previous years the chaplaincy still has an adequate supply for this year.





This evening we will be marking the end of the church year with a special treat! There will be a service of traditional prayer book choral evensong featuring music by Tallis, Gibbons and Vaughan Williams to mark the close of the church's liturgical year before moving into the season of

Advent. The service will be led by David Pickup and the music will be provided by the Vale Singers, conducted by Christopher Dalladay.

#### Stir Up Sunday

As well as the collect prayer for this day beginning with 'Stir up we beseech thee O lord', today is also the day when people traditionally 'stirred up' their Christmas puddings. That was in the days before they were available to buy (with much less effort) in the shops. So, today is the best day to dig out Grandma's old recipe for Christmas pudding if you want to impress the family with it on Christmas Day. To do it properly though here is a reminder of the rules you should follow:

- 1. Every member of the family should have a turn at stirring the pudding.
- 2. There should be 13 ingredients to represent Jesus and each of his disciples.
- You must stir from East to West because the Wise Men Came from the East. Whether this means clockwise or anticlockwise is for your family to debate. Do not go straight across the middle though as this would not qualify as 'stirring'.

#### Posada 2024

Advent is a special time in the church calendar when we prepare for the coming of Jesus. It is a period for us in the church to reflect and wait. Our annual Posada begins **NEXT WEEK** on Advent Sunday. During the Posada our figures of Mary and Joseph stay with a different host household each night before moving on. As well as receiving Mary and Joseph each host takes them on to the next host the following day. For those with mobility issues we can arrange for someone to collect the figures from you. We minister to one another by spending a few minutes together at the handover. This involves some very simple prayers that are already written down for you to say together.
