This is a Christian charity that believes nobody is beyond hope. Its mission is 'to show Christ's love to people in prison by coming alongside them and supporting them'.

PF is a national charity but operates in prisons local to us as well. This includes Aylesbury, Springhill and Grendon, and Bullingdon. You will hear more about our prisons in October when it is national Prisons Week. Our coffee cup money will be going into the national PF pot but earmarked for Aylesbury.

PF are running two programmes in Aylesbury prison this autumn. One is the six week Sycamore Tree course about victim awareness and restorative justice, and the other is the Christmas Angel Tree project. All prisons are under a lot of pressure at the moment with early releases being planned in September. That involves a lot of administrative work and puts more pressure on the Probation services. Please pray for those who are being released, for their families, for the prison and probation services, and for the prison chaplains.



John 6:56-69

⁵⁶ Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them. ⁵⁷ Just as the living Father sent me and I live because of the Father, so the one who feeds on me will live because of me. ⁵⁸ This is the bread that came down from heaven. Your ancestors ate manna and died, but whoever feeds on this bread will live for ever.' ⁵⁹ He said this while teaching in the synagogue in Capernaum.

Many disciples desert Jesus

unless the Father has enabled them.'

⁶⁰ On hearing it, many of his disciples said, 'This is a hard teaching. Who can accept it?'
⁶¹ Aware that his disciples were grumbling about this, Jesus said to them, 'Does this offend you? ⁶² Then what if you see the Son of Man ascend to where he was before!
⁶³ The Spirit gives life; the flesh counts for nothing. The words I have spoken to you – they are full of the Spirit and life. ⁶⁴ Yet there are some of you who do not believe.' For Jesus had known from the beginning which of them did not believe and who would betray him. ⁶⁵ He went on to say, 'This is why I told you that no one can come to me

- ⁶⁶ From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him.
- ⁶⁷ 'You do not want to leave too, do you?' Jesus asked the Twelve.
- ⁶⁸ Simon Peter answered him, 'Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. ⁶⁹ We have come to believe and to know that you are the Holy One of God'.

Let's be honest — it can be hard to live out the Christian life every day. Sometimes we may even feel like giving up. Following Jesus is TOUGH - even though it is the way to life in 'all its fulness'. This chapter in John begins with many people following Jesus, but it ends with many turning back. Now look again at the response from Simon Peter when Jesus asked his disciples if they wanted to leave him too (verses 68-69). There will be costs to following Jesus, but what Jesus offers us is a quality of life that the Holy Spirit brings. Only Jesus can give us the Holy Spirit. Only Jesus can give us fulness of life.
