BELONG - BELIEVE - BUILD - WITH CHRIST AS THE CORNERSTONE

Luke 24:28-35

²⁸ As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus continued on as if he were going farther. ²⁹ But they urged him strongly, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them.

³⁰ When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. ³¹ Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. ³² They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?"

³³ They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, assembled together ³⁴ and saying, "It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon." ³⁵ Then the two told what had happened on the way, and how Jesus was recognized by them when he broke the bread.

This account picks up the story of two people who were walking to Emmaus on the day that Jesus had risen – but they did not know, or believe, that had happened. Imagine the disappointment they were feeling when their hopes that Jesus would redeem Israel appeared to have been dashed. Even though Jesus had told his disciples many times that he would suffer and die they had not grasped his real purpose. Their eyes were closed - they didn't even recognise him as he walked with them. Sometimes we just cannot see what is directly in front of us – like when we search through a cupboard for something that is right at the front all the time. And so Jesus taught them from the scriptures in ways they could understand.

When Jesus seemed to be going on further **they urged him strongly to stay with them**, and so he did, sharing bread with them at their table. There is an important lesson here for us. When Jesus comes to walk with us and opens our eyes to understand who he really is **we need to make a choice** – are we going to let him go his own way while we go on ours – or are we going to invite him to stay and walk with us? We know what choice these two followers made. They returned to Jerusalem (no doubt in great excitement) to tell the others how their eyes were opened when Jesus shared the bread with them. **He was no longer just a good teacher, but their risen Lord, worthy to be worshipped and glorified.**

There is an opportunity today for us to share bread in our service today in the way that Jesus taught us to do.
