John 15:1-8

The Vine and the Branches

15 "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ² He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. ³ You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴ Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.

5 "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. 6 If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. 7 If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. 8 This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.

The focus of this passage is on Jesus as the true vine. We are reminded that we cannot bear fruit in our own strength. But, when we remain in Jesus, our lives can be fruitful.

Thy Kingdom Come

We are preparing several ways for us all to take part in TKC this year because we each pray in our own way. This is an opportunity for us to bring our prayers together in a mighty wave of prayer that will be going around the world very soon!
