Matthew 25:31-40

The sheep and the goats

³¹ 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his glorious throne. ³² All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. ³³ He will put the sheep on his right and the goats on his left.

³⁴ 'Then the King will say to those on his right, "Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. ³⁵ For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, ³⁶ I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was ill and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me."

³⁷ 'Then the righteous will answer him, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? ³⁸ When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? ³⁹ When did we see you ill or in prison and go to visit you?"

⁴⁰ 'The King will reply, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

World Day of Prayer Service (last Friday)

The World Day of Prayer Service on Friday saw the Chapel almost full. Representing the produce and flora of Palestine, heaped baskets of citrus fruit, poppies and olive branches decorated the front table, along with the Bible and World Day of Prayer candle. Everyone received a bookmark endorsed with the words 'Put peace into each other's hands and like a treasure hold it' and a sprig of olive leaves.

Prepared by Christian women of Palestine it had of course much resonance with the current tragic situation in their country, although prepared more than two years ago. Everyone agreed that it was a moving, meaningful and positive Service, which left us hopeful that with such goodwill at ground level there is hope for this troubled part of God's world.

World Day of Prayer offerings support many good causes, ranging from support for homeless women and children in Great Britain to those working with victims of sexual slavery in Bangkok, and providing educational programmes and safe shelters for girls in Ghana. The offering at our Service amounted to £212.00 with an additional £21.00 to come from Gift Aid.

Coffee Cup news

From today until the end of April our coffee cup collections will be given to **Aylesbury Homeless Action Group.** AHAG is a local charity based in Rickfords Hill in Aylesbury. It provides support and advice to those who are homeless; at risk of becoming homeless; or who are inadequately housed.

Examples of services offered are:

- One to one appointments with a support worker to discuss housing options and develop a plan of action.
- A weekly surgery offering advice and support about benefits.
- Mental health support from a trained mental health worker.
- Vouchers can be issued for use at the local foodbank.
- A new drop in advice service every Friday at Aylesbury Library 9:30 12:30

From January to December 2023 AHAG supported 490 people of whom 289 also had mental health issues.
