Prison Fellowship (episode five)

This is a Christian charity that believes nobody is beyond hope. Its mission is 'to show Christ's love to people in prison by coming alongside them and supporting them'.

As a young eighteen-year-old Sylvia Mary Alison first heard God calling her to develop Christian ministry in our prisons, but was not clear about the way forward. At first, she was "appalled and afraid", but in 1974, Sylvia and her husband Michael Alison, a member of the UK parliament, visited Washington DC and met Charles Colson, who had just founded Prison Fellowship in the USA. Sylvia believed this was the answer to her prayers, and so in 1979 Prison Fellowship England and Wales was founded. PF now has around 100 local groups, with committed volunteers praying for our prisons, supporting the work of chaplaincies, and running the PF programmes already featured in other episodes of the pewsheet. There is a local group that meets once a month for prayer in Aylesbury.



Donations to St Luke's Healthcare for the Clergy via the Coffee Cup Collection in May and June totalled £100.50.

Donations to Christian Aid from service collections and Tuesday Cafe donations totalled £269.08.

²⁴ Once the crowd realized that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they got into the boats and went to Capernaum in search of Jesus.

Jesus the Bread of Life

²⁵ When they found him on the other side of the lake, they asked him, "Rabbi, when did you get here?"

Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw the signs I performed but because you ate the loaves and had your fill. ²⁷ Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him God the Father has placed his seal of approval."

²⁸ Then they asked him, "What must we do to do the works God requires?"



²⁹ Jesus answered, "The work of God is this: to believe in the one he has sent."

³² Jesus said to them, "Very truly I tell you, it is not Moses who has given you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. ³³ For the bread of God is the bread that comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."

³⁴ "Sir," they said, "always give us this bread."

³⁵ Then Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.

Physical bread from any bakery is not enough to satisfy us. Material things alone can never satisfy us. Hunger quickly returns. Even our human relationships do not satisfy our deepest desires for ultimate purpose in life.

The bread that <u>DOES</u> satisfy is the 'Bread of Life'. This is not a *commodity* that Jesus supplies – he <u>IS</u> both the 'Bread of life' <u>AND</u> the giver of it.

It is easy (even after you have put your faith in Jesus) to get caught up in material things, or to focus on just the outward trappings of religion. How many times have we seen famous celebrities who appear to 'have it all' who then destroy themselves by searching for yet more? They are never feeling satisfied by what they have, or by what they have achieved. Inside there is still a deep and gnawing hunger.

It is only in maintaining a relationship with Jesus that ultimately our spiritual hunger can be satisfied, and Jesus gives himself freely to all who come to him. We don't have to be celebrities for that.

Little Wrigglers

Little Wrigglers started on 18th April – would anyone come?? Yes was the answer. We have a core group of children attending each session – averaging 13 children.
