The Parable of the Persistent Widow

18 Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up. ² He said: "In a certain town there was a judge who neither feared God nor cared what people thought. ³ And there was a widow in that town who kept coming to him with the plea, 'Grant me justice against my adversary.'

⁴ "For some time he refused. But finally he said to himself, 'Even though I don't fear God or care what people think, ⁵ yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will see that she gets justice, so that she won't eventually come and attack me!'"

⁶ And the Lord said, "Listen to what the unjust judge says. ⁷ And will not God bring about justice for his chosen ones, who cry out to him day and night? Will he keep putting them off? ⁸ I tell you, he will see that they get justice, and quickly. However, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?"

Most people pray at least sometimes, but when we keep on praying and nothing seems to happen we are tempted to give up. Is God listening? Is he even there? This parable reminds us to keep on praying and that all prayers **are** heard but they are not necessarily answered when, or how we want. We still need to pray and not give up.

The God centred life is a life of consistent prayer. You can talk to God not just in church or at set times, but anywhere and at any time. A popular phrase for this is to 'talk as you walk'.

"...When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?"

Church attendance has fallen from pre pandemic times and not yet fully recovered. Even if we do not feel able to commit to going to church regularly we can all still pray. Some of you have said you like to read the pewsheet in bed on a Sunday morning before you get up. So, before you read the other pages just pause for two minutes and say 'Good morning' to God and ask for his blessing and guidance throughout the day ahead.

Lent study course

The groups will meet once a week during the 5 weeks of Lent (which starts on Ash Wednesday on 14th February). The aim is to deepen our spiritual life and commitment to Jesus. More information will come out soon, but please think if you can give up a couple of hours for something that could be inspiring for you and others.
