Luke 19:28-40

Jesus Comes to Jerusalem as King

²⁸ After Jesus had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. ²⁹ As he approached Bethphage and Bethany at the hill called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, ³⁰ "Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. ³¹ If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' say, 'The Lord needs it.'"

³² Those who were sent ahead went and found it just as he had told them. ³³ As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?"

³⁴ They replied, "The Lord needs it."

³⁵ They brought it to Jesus, threw their cloaks on the colt and put Jesus on it. ³⁶ As he went along, people spread their cloaks on the road.

³⁷ When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen:

³⁸ "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

³⁹ Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!"

⁴⁰ "I tell you," he replied, "if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out."

Each of the four Gospels has an account of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on what we have come to call Palm Sunday. There are slight differences between them, but there is much material in common. They each use phrases from Psalm 118, to echo older stories of King David (or other kings) entering the holy city and being welcomed by cheering people. It's interesting that Luke is the only Gospel not to mention the waving of branches, but that detail is certainly there in the other three (as it is in Psalm 118)

Jesus was a great storyteller and Luke recorded some of his best stories like *The Good Samaritan – The Pharisee and the Tax Collector – the Prodigal Son* We know these parables so well, but in our studies we are drawing on the experience of Palestinian shepherds and farmers to ty to understand them as Jesus intended. This is our final session of the series, but it isn't too late to join us.
